



## DORSET LADIES COUNTY GOLF ASSOCIATION

### County Delegates Meeting Dorchester Bowls Club Friday 13<sup>th</sup> July 2018

<p>The meeting was opened by Tracy Bryant County Captain who welcomed everyone. Tracy apologized, as due to family reasons, she would be leaving the meeting early. Consequently the agenda items would be taken out of sequence and Grace Burke, County President, would take over the meeting after Tracy's departure.</p>	
<p><b>1. Apologies</b> – there were 11 apologies.</p>	
<p><b>2.</b> The minutes of the previous meeting 16<sup>th</sup> February 2018, with the following amendments, were approved and signed.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• County Junior Officers Report – Item 6 para 2 page 4. Tracy received an email from Dee Wood advising us that in 2014 there were also 14 girls training in the academy. Apologies to Dee for this omission.</li><li>• Handicap Advisors Report – page 6 bullet 5 – Option 1 should read “if there is NO limit”.</li></ul>	
<p><b>3. Matters Arising.</b> SW Regional Rep. The report mentioned that Parkstone would be holding the E.G. Ladies European Championships in 2019. Subsequently Tracy has had communication from Parkstone's Management (agenda item 13) requesting volunteers and support. The dates are 22<sup>nd</sup> July - 27<sup>th</sup> July 2019.</p> <p>Data Protection Regulations (agenda item 10) – The policy is now on the DLCGA website and is being implemented.</p> <p>Correspondence – Terry LeQuesne had asked if the 'Lady Club Officers List' could be published on the website. Following discussion it was decided 'no' due to the Data Protection Regulations.</p>	
<p><b>4. Correspondence</b> – None.</p>	
<p><b>7. Pace of Play.</b> This has come to the fore due to problems in a variety of recent competitions with Tracy receiving complaints of players' inappropriate conduct.</p>	

<p>Consequently a 'Pace of Play Policy' has been suggested by the executive. This is based on EG and R&amp;A Pace of Play Guidelines. <b>(Please see attached document)</b>.</p> <p><b>Karen Gray</b> (Dudsbury) – she sees the problem also with new players taking on-board advice given by their pro teacher.</p> <p><b>Julia Norman</b> (Vets Captain) - perhaps the pros should also be spoken to!</p> <p>A suggestion would be to put in more breaks to prevent 'backing up' but this could cost the DLPGA more money.</p> <p><b>Ann Talbot</b> (Handicap Advisor). The R7A is introducing 'Ready Golf' in 2019. There will only be a 3 minute allowance to look for lost balls and all clubs will be introducing it.</p> <p><b>Jane Southcombe</b> – suggested that this be included in the Junior Policy. However Sheila says this is already in place and she actually times players.</p> <p><b>Tracy</b> - Wants the policy to be in place but does not want to seem heavy handed.</p> <p>The delegates present had no objections to the policy being implemented.</p>	KR
<p><b>8. Interclub Rules re hosting semi and final competitions.</b></p> <p><b>Tracy</b> went through the options as detailed in the previous minutes. She had received an email from Parkstone their preference would be for the rules to remain the same but with the club refusing in one year to offer to host the following year.</p> <p><b>Jackie Wilson (Knighton Heath and Kay Everett (Ashley Wood))</b> felt strongly the bookings should come from the exec as they had the power to say that if a club can't offer a date they wont be able to play that year.</p> <p><b>Ann Talbot (Handicap Advisor)</b> – said that the Ladies Vice Captains have to go to the club to book matches so it is easy for them to book semi/final at this point.</p> <p>The majority of those clubs present and those responding by email felt that <b>option 2</b> would be best whereby the vice captain when planning her diary for the following year would book the semi /final at that point.</p> <p>Tracy - this is a more softly, softly, approach and will not require a rule change but if the clubs are not happy and its not working it will be revisited. The dates are booked for 2019 so it will start in 2020.</p> <p><b>Sue Winkle – Bridport</b> asked whether we could discuss <b>Interclub team sizes</b> at this point. It was agreed. Bridport are struggling to get a team of seven and are relying on bronze players being available. Could the team size be reduced to 5?</p> <p>It was pointed out that this had been discussed as recently as 2016 and voted on. The majority of clubs voting for a continuation of 7 players.</p> <p><b>Karen Gray</b> (Dudsbury) – they were just as successful using bronze as silver players.</p> <p><b>Ann Talbot</b> (Hcp Advisor) asked Margaret Swift (Interclub Secretary) whether she could see from the match sheets how many clubs this affected and the range of handicaps used.</p> <p><b>Sue Winkle</b> suggested that larger clubs could put in 2 teams.</p> <p><b>Ann Talbot</b> said a lot of Counties have a Scratch Interclub competition. Currently low</p>	

<p>handicap players are generally not playing.  <b>Kate Roberts</b> (Ass Sec) replied by saying they were not all making themselves available.  <b>Sue Stannard</b> (Remedy Oak) – said that going back to the format where you played home and away on alternate years would not make any difference to availability.  <b>Karen Gray</b> (Dudsbury) – suggested that if there were teams of 7 players would put the date in their diary if it were only 5 then players might not think it worthwhile as they wouldn't be chosen.</p> <p>Following this discussion it was decided to send a separate email to clubs to ask whether they are considering withdrawing and would it make a difference if the teams were reduced to 5 players.</p>	KR
<p><b>At this point Tracy gave her apologies and Grace took over the meeting.</b></p>	
<p><b>5. Captain's Report for Delegates' Meeting Friday July 13<sup>th</sup> 2018 Tracy Bryant</b>  (read by Kate Roberts Ass Sec)</p> <p>Since our last meeting, we have had most of our County competitions - including South West Inter County Match week at St Enodoc. I will read a summary of each competition in order to save your time, but if you should require further detail all of my reports can be found on the Dorset Ladies Golf website.</p> <p><b>Seniors' Championship 4<sup>th</sup> May at Moors Valley Golf Club</b></p> <p>This was our first competition after the snow and we found the course in excellent condition.  Huge congratulations to Jane Southcombe of Yeovil GC on winning the title of Dorset Seniors' Champion 2018 with a very creditable gross 79. She wins The Holmes Cup.  Anita Sweatland from Ferndown GC put in a fine performance to win the Centenary Bowl with a nett score of 70.</p> <p><b>Silver Spring Challenge 9<sup>th</sup> May at Dudsbury GC</b></p> <p>This competition kicked off our Championship meeting with some great golf.  The first-place Gross went to Georgina Wrixon of Ashley Wood with gross 84, RU was Cathy MacFarlane-Thompson of Broadstone with gross 86 and in 3<sup>rd</sup> place we had Kate Cornell of Sherborne with gross 87.  The nett competition was won by Broadstone's Kate Roberts with nett 76, after countback Erica Howard (also of Broadstone) was the RU, followed by Kate Cornell of Sherborne also on nett 76.</p> <p><b>The Johnstone Cup 9<sup>th</sup> - 11<sup>th</sup> May at Dudsbury GC</b></p> <p>We had three fantastic days of golf. The first day brought in some impressive scores with Sue Jackson of Broadstone winning the best Gross and The Threlfall Cup with gross 86. She also won the best nett with a nett 72 and takes home the Sugden Salver. This led us on to the matchplay between the top 16 which was very exciting. Lots of the matches went to the 18<sup>th</sup> hole and some on to the 19<sup>th</sup> and beyond.</p>	

We had two hard fought semis between Parkstone's Pam Dobbs and Emma Hardy from Dudsbury, and Broadstone's Sandi Stott and Binnie Blackburn from The Dorset Golf and Country Club. Sandi and Emma came out victorious.

The final was an excellent advert for women's golf. In the end, Sandi beat Emma to take The Johnstone Cup - though they both deserve huge credit.

### **The County Championship 11<sup>th</sup> – 13<sup>th</sup> July at Dudsbury GC**

We have had some fantastic days of golf. Scarlett Williams of Parkstone GC won best Gross and The Ivy Carroll Cup with gross 159. Molly Kington put in a fine performance with nett 145. She takes home the Carter Bowl.

This led us on to the matchplay between the top 16 which was very exciting, followed by two hard fought semis today between Parkstone's Scarlett Williams and Hermione Christy-Clover, and between Broadstone's Becky Hobell and Alice Webb from Parkstone. Alice and Scarlett came out victorious which set up the afternoon's final. Both girls in the final had played some incredible golf in the week.

In the end, Scarlett beat Alice with some incredible play to win the title and The Huleatt Cup. She is a fine County Champion.

Alice takes home the runner up prize of The Eleanor Morris Dish. They both deserve huge credit.

The last thing I'd like to say is that I have been so impressed with the level of sportsmanship and camaraderie that I have seen this week from everyone. I have been very proud to have been a part of it.

### **The Bronze Spring Meeting 24<sup>th</sup> May at Bournemouth and Meyrick Park GC**

This competition started off in dry weather and I hoped that the forecasts for heavy rain later in the day would hold off. Unfortunately, and to many players' disappointment my hopes were dashed. After much soul searching and at quite a late stage, I had to call the competition off due to a waterlogged course. It was not a decision that I took lightly and although some may have thought I should have made my decision earlier, I tried to get the first competition in as some had very good scores – even those playing in the driving rain.

The competitions have been rescheduled for the 30<sup>th</sup> August. Fingers are firmly crossed for better weather.

### **The Over 70's competition 7<sup>th</sup> June at Christchurch GC**

Again, the weather let us down – but at least we were able to finish this competition. We had some really good scores over the nine holes, considering the rain. Gill Freakes from Ferndown was our runner up with 17 Stableford points. Congratulations to our overall winner Jan Carter, from Moors Valley with a score of 19 stableford points. She won the Over 70's Salver.

### **Intercounty Foursomes 19<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup> June at Bridport GC**

At the end of the first rounds for the Scratch, Silver and Bronze we had semi –finalists from Broadstone, Parkstone, Dorset GCC and Ferndown; Dudsbury, Bridport, Queens Park and Ashley Wood; and Bridport, Isle of Purbeck, Yeovil and Queens Park.

In the Scratch final, Broadstone won against a very strong Parkstone team. I am told that some amazing golf was played by both teams.

I refereed the Silver final between Queen's Park and Bridport. I too saw some incredible shots played. In the end, Bridport were beaten by a Queen's Park team that made very few mistakes.

The Bronze final between Isle of Purbeck and Yeovil brought up the rear. Isle of Purbeck were the winners over a team from Yeovil that kept on coming at them.

It was a great two days of golf and everyone thoroughly enjoyed it.

### **SW Inter County Match Week 2<sup>nd</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> July at St Enodoc GC**

Our team certainly did us proud on what proved a very tricky, if awesome, golf course.

On Monday, we narrowly lost to Gloucestershire 5-4. On Tuesday we also lost, this time to Somerset – 5.5 to 3.5. **6c Treasurer’s Report - Lindsay Beaumont 09/07/2018**

Our balances as at 1 July 2018 were:

Current account	8,980.40
Deposit account	22,501.10
Total	<u>31,481.50</u>

This allows for all income and expenditure which has been notified to me up to the end of June 2018. Since 1 July I have paid out just over £1,200, including £800 disbursement fee to Bridport, and transferred £4,000 to the Deposit account. I have also paid in just over £1,200 in entry fees for competitions.

This compares with a total balance at the same date last year of £33,489 and includes approximately £9,000 'ring fenced' for the juniors.

We have received £9,610 to date in affiliation fees for 2018; by approximately the same date last year (the accounting dates are not identical) we had received £9,170 for 2017.

### **6d Handicap Adviser's Report - Ann Talbot**

Quite a number of ladies were able to attend the **World Handicap Seminars** held by England Golf and I am sure that they found the proposals interesting. The details were discussed at our Handicap Meeting in May and should have been taken back to Clubs. The System is not due to be introduced until 2020 so further updates will be forthcoming in the future.

I received a query on a **Flag competition**. I emailed EG and they have confirmed, once again, that a flag competition **cannot** be Qualifying for handicap. A flag competition is not a recognised form of play by the R&A.

Clubs have been asked by England Golf to cleanse their **CDH Systems**. When I visited CDH website recently, I found a considerable number of players 'unknown' indicating that they are no longer members.

The R&A and USGA have produced a draft document of the proposed **Rules Modernisation**. This draft can be downloaded in pdf. from the R&A website. The new rules are due for implementation on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2019. Videos can also be seen explaining the new rules which are very interesting.

### **6e County Junior Organiser Report - Sheila Davidge**

#### **6f Veterans Report - Julia Norman**

The Vets season began with the South West Field Day held at the Isle of Wedmore on 23<sup>rd</sup> March. Despite the recent snow and rainfall it was blessed with a lovely day and the course was in excellent condition. I am pleased to report that Dorset had 2 ladies in the prizes both from Sherborne, Julia Norman 2<sup>nd</sup> in low bronze and Jenny Hill 3<sup>rd</sup> in high bronze. The SW Autumn Field Day will be held at Trevoze GC in Cornwall on Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> September and celebrates SW Vets 60<sup>th</sup> birthday.

Our own Vets Spring meeting was held at Crane Valley on 9<sup>th</sup> April but unfortunately was not blessed with the fine weather experienced at Wedmore. A magnificent 46 pairs entered the competition and 43 braved the awful conditions most of whom completed the round. My grateful thanks goes to all participants but also to the Seniors Captain at Crane Valley who stepped in to mark a card at the last minute also to Val and Sue from Crane Valley who were a tremendous help. The scores reflected the bad state of the course but congratulations to Monica Seeley and Susan Knott of Parkstone for winning the Cumberledge Ware Spoons with 32 points, the 3 runners up all shared the same score of 31 points. Once again the prizes were well distributed with 7 different clubs featuring.

The Autumn Meeting is at Sherborne on Monday 24<sup>th</sup> September and once again I am pleading for delegates to drum up support within their clubs for this event. To this end I have brought a few posters and entry forms with me today should anyone need a copy. As I suspect many of you know 4 of Sherborne's fairways and the tees were accidentally treated incorrectly back in the Spring which resulted in the grass dying and going brown. Remedial treatment was immediately undertaken and we have been assured by the Chairman that the course will be back to normal by the end of July and with this spell of dry weather most courses are suffering similarly. A reminder that the Millennium Rose Bowl is presented at the AGM to the club with the

We played Somerset at home and won 5/2; then Devon away at East Devon where we lost 2 ½ / 4 ½ then on Monday and Wednesday of this week we played Hampshire at Knighton Heath and won 5/2 and Cornwall at Dudsbury where we lost 2 ½ / 4 ½ . My Vice Captain, Rosemary Shepherd has been busy arranging 2019 fixtures and these will appear on the website shortly.</p> <p>I am delighted to report that Bridport will be taking over the Vets in 2021/22. Nat West Bank completely mismanaged the Vets account when I moved and have subsequently credited it with £50 as an apology. I would like approval from this meeting to add this to my charity.</p> <p><b>This was duly approved by the exec and delegates present.</b></p>	
<p><b>9. Handicap Allowances for County Competitions.</b></p> <p>This was brought to the delegates attention at the last meeting due to Hcp allowances being increased to a maximum of 54 and they were asked to vote on the following -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• High Bronze maximum of 36 increase to 40 <b>AGREED</b></li> <li>• Over 70s maximum of 36 increase to 40 <b>AGREED</b></li> <li>• Senior Championships to remain at 36hcp as it is already very well supported and applicants have had to be balloted out. <b>AGREED</b></li> <li>• Bowmaker – currently there is no upper limit. Ann Talbot Hcp Advisor suggested that there be an upper limit of 40 to enter but the players to play off 36 - <b>AGREED</b></li> <li>• Interclub Foursomes – to continue with 36 limit - <b>AGREED</b></li> </ul>	
<p><b>11. Associate Members.</b></p> <p>Currently the rules state that for entry to County Championships players must be full members of the county. For all other county competitions players must be full or affiliated. However England Golf now run national competitions whereby the winners of County Competitions go through to the National finals. This applies to Senior and Junior Championships. Under current rules a player from another county could win the Senior or Junior championships and be eligible to go to the national finals. Therefore the executive would like approval from the Delegates to take this to the AGM for a rule change. Ie ‘All players entering County Championships, Senior and Junior Championships <b>must be</b> full members of the County Association’. <b>AGREED</b>. An amendment will be prepared for the AGM.</p>	GB
